




# FY24 BUDGET City Wide Budget – all Funds

**REVENUE** \$118,758,566









#### **Residential Transfers Fiscal Year 2023 YTD**






### Deerpath Community Park Improvement Project

  - Two restroom buildings,
  - Renovated tennis/pickleball courts
  - Playground & Fitness stations, and
  - Natural area enhancements
- Construction: April through mid-October




# Ward 2 Projects





- City-wide evaluation performed every 5 years
- Overall sidewalk panels are evaluated by categorical ratings
- Goal: Replace all hazardous sidewalk conditions
- Staff uses evaluation to prioritize sidewalk panel replacements annually





### Gaslight to LED Conversion Program



- Began summer 2018
- 50+ gaslights have been converted in Ward 2 to date
- Once completed, City anticipates saving
   \$50,000/year in natural gas costs and saving
   \$27,000/year on maintenance costs



# Rockefeller Rd, McCormick Dr, Loch Ln Ravine Construction



- Project will address failed or failing City storm sewer infrastructure within these three ravine areas
- Features sustainability components such as native plant material
- Project to begin June –
   October, with a 2-month construction duration



### South Park Improvements




- Phase 1 of improvements completed in 2020
- Phase 2 includes several more amenities and park improvements
- Invasive species clearing completed this winter with more restoration ahead




### Ahwahnee Rd Storm Sewer Upgrade

- Priority project in both the 2013 and 2019 Storm Water Masterplan
- Several street floods in recent years (affects emergency response)
- Storm sewer replacement and upsizing (and resurfacing)
- Design will increase capacity from 2year event to 10-year storm event
- Submitted for Lake County SMC grant October 2022
- Tentative construction Winter-Spring 2024





# City-Wide Construction Projects



## Forest Park Bluff Stabilization

- Stabilization of remaining bluff areas via the installation of retaining walls, wick drains and native drainage areas
- Project construction will occur after the beach closes (Labor Day) and will be completed prior to the beach reopening (Memorial Day)

### **Environmental Sustainability**

- Efforts directed through Aldermen-led Committee
- Provides input into capital projects and operating budget initiatives
- Identified community priorities and four focus areas
- National ICMA Award for the Rethink Recycling Campaign
